

The Glasgow City Council (City Centre) (Traffic Management) Order 2010

Glasgow City Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 19, 20, 32, 35, 37, 38, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 51, 52, 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

Citation and Commencement

1. a) This Order may be cited as "The Glasgow City Council (City Centre) (Traffic Management) Order 2010" and shall come into operation on 29 August 2010.
- b) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
- c) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

Definitions

2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"Administration fee" means the charge for the replacement of a lost or damaged Resident Parking Permit;

"Authorised bus" means any bus authorised by the Chief Constable to gain access to Gordon Street;

"Bus", "local bus" and "local service" all have the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"Bus lane" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"Cycle lane" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"Bus, taxi, private hire car and cycle lane" has the same meaning as "Bus lane" or "Cycle lane" but with the additional permission for use by "taxis and private hire cars";

"Chief Constable" means Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police;

"Contra-flow" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

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“Council” means Glasgow City Council;

“Disabled person’s badge” has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002;

“Disabled vehicle” means a vehicle displaying a Disabled person’s badge in the “relevant position”;

“Dual-purpose vehicle” has the same meaning as is given to the expression in Regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;

“Emergency services vehicle” means a vehicle being used by Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Services or Civil Defence Organisation;

“Emergency services purposes” means the saving of life or extinguishing fire or meeting any other like emergency;

“Goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle or trailer, constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and taxed as one of the following:- Light goods Vehicle, Euro 4 Light Goods Vehicle, Private HGV, Rigid, two and three axled articulated vehicles, Rigid vehicles, Trailers, Two axled tractive unit articulated vehicles and Three axled tractive unit articulated vehicles, but not including a dual-purpose vehicle;

“Marked police vehicle” means a police vehicle marked with Police livery;

“Motorcycle” has the same meaning as is given to the expression in Regulation (3) (2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;

“Nearside” means, in relation to the position on a vehicle windscreen for the displaying of a permit, the side which is nearest to the edge of the carriageway when said vehicle is parked in a parking place;

“Parking attendant” means any person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to issue penalty charge notices;

“Parking charge” means that sum required to be paid in respect of leaving of a vehicle in a parking place or parking space;

“Parking place” means an area on a road designated as a parking place in Schedules 26 to 35 inclusive;

“Parking space” means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

“Parking ticket machine” means an apparatus designed (a) to accept payment (by whatever means) and (b) to issue tickets indicating the payment charged (by whatever means) and time/date of expiry of the parking permitted by the ticket;

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- “Passenger vehicle”** has the same meaning as is given to the expression in Regulation (3) (2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;
- “Pedal cycle”** means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
- “Penalty Charge Notice”** means a device containing the information required by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, for a penalty charge notice;
- “Permit holders vehicle”** means a vehicle displaying a permit issued by a local authority;
- “Private Hire Car”** has the same meaning as in Section 23 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;
- “Public holiday”** means Christmas Day, and New Year's Day;
- “Public service vehicle”** has the same meaning as defined in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;
- “Relevant position”** has the same meaning as in Regulation 12 of the Disabled Person (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2002;
- “Resident parking permit”** means a badge or disc issued by the Council, in accordance with the provisions of this Order;
- “Roller skate”** means a boot or shoe mounted on rollers or wheels attachable to the foot;
- “Skateboard”** means a board or platform or connected board or platform mounted on rollers or wheels;
- “Solo motorcycle”** means a motor cycle without a side car and having two wheels;
- “St Enoch bus link road 1”** means that length of road which extends from Howard Street (that section which lies adjacent to St Enoch Square) to the north kerbline of Howard Street (that section which lies adjacent to Dunlop Street)
- “St Enoch bus link road 2”** means the unnamed road which gives access to the Osborne Street car park from St Enoch bus link road 1.
- “Taxi”** has the same meaning as in Section 23 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;
- “Taxi rank”** has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;
- “Telecommunications apparatus”** has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act, 1984;

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“Universal postal service” has the same meaning as in the Section 4 Postal Services Act 2000;

“Vehicle” unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether by animal or mechanical power;

“With-flow lane” has the same meaning given in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

“Inner Area” means the area identified as such and as shown in Schedule 55 Inner and Outer Area Plan, hereof;

“Outer Area” means the area identified as such and as shown in Schedule 55 Inner and Outer Area Plan, hereof;

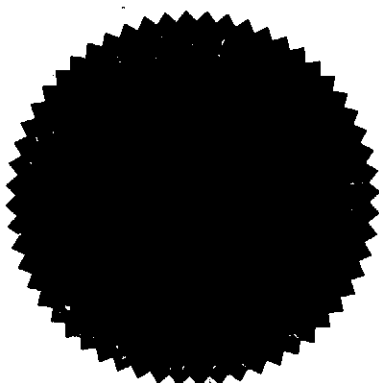
“Zone” means an area of Glasgow identified as such and as shown in Schedule 54 Zone Plan. Each zone can be designated by either letter or group of letters identifying an area;

“Zone identifier” means a letter or group of letters identifying an area throughout which parking permits are made available for purchase.

Format of the Order

3. In the following Schedules of this Order there are Articles pertaining to each particular Schedule outlining the restrictions, permissions and conditions relevant for each particular Schedule. Each Schedule shall precede the Articles pertaining to that Schedule.

Articles pertaining to Schedule 1
No waiting at any time

Waiting restrictions

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1.

Exemptions from waiting restrictions

2. Nothing in Article 1 hereof shall:-
 - (i) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes;
 - (c) if the vehicle is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;
 - (d) if the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal postal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for the delivery and collection of postal packets;
 - (ii) apply to a pedal cycle attached to a stand which displays the sign corresponding to The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 diagram number 968 or 968.1;
 - (iii) apply to a vehicle left in a parking space designated in Schedules 26 to 35 in accordance with the Articles pertaining thereto;
 - (iv) apply to a disabled vehicle. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway;
 - (v) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway. The vehicle shall not load or unload for longer than 30 minutes in the same place in total and shall not wait for longer than 10 minutes in the same place without goods or merchandise being loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

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**Articles pertaining to Schedule 1
No waiting at any time**

Penalty Charge

3. (i) A penalty charge, as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is waiting in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1 to 2 hereof.
(ii) The penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.
(iii) A penalty charge notice shall be attached to the vehicle, or handed to the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, incurring the penalty charge.
4. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 3 (iii) hereof, no person, other than the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle. Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.
5. If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 3 hereof, a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed. If it is removed the Council shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

6. Subject to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the Council may, as respects a vehicle which has been removed in pursuance with Article 5 hereof, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle if it appears to have been abandoned, provided they have made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle and to inform the owner of their intention.

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Articles pertaining to Schedule 2
No waiting during Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm

Waiting restrictions

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 1pm in any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2.

Exemptions from waiting restrictions

2. Nothing in Article 1 hereof shall:-
 - (i) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes
 - (c) if the vehicle is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;
 - (d) if the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal postal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for the delivery and collection of postal packets;
 - (e) outwith Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm;
 - (ii) apply to a pedal cycle attached to a stand which displays the sign corresponding to The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 diagram number 968 or 968.1;
 - (iii) apply to a vehicle left in a parking space designated in Schedules 26 to 35 in accordance with the Articles pertaining thereto;
 - (iv) apply to a disabled vehicle. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway;
 - (v) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway. The vehicle shall not load or unload for longer than 30 minutes in the same place in total and shall not wait for longer than 10 minutes in the same place without goods or merchandise being loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

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Articles pertaining to Schedule 2

No waiting during Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm

Penalty Charge

3. (i) A penalty charge, as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is waiting in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1 to 2 hereof.
 - (ii) The penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.
 - (iii) A penalty charge notice shall be attached to the vehicle, or handed to the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, incurring the penalty charge.
4. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 3 (iii) hereof, no person, other than the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle. Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.

Waiting restrictions

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3.

Loading or unloading restrictions

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload during Monday to Saturday 8.15am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6.30pm in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3.

Exemptions from waiting restrictions

3. Nothing in Article 1 hereof shall:-
 - (i) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes
 - (c) if the vehicle is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;

No loading or unloading during
Monday to Saturday 8.15am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6.30pm

Exemptions from loading or unloading restrictions

4. Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to load or unload in the lengths of road referred to in that Article outwith Monday to Saturday 8.15am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6.30pm for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of the carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway. The vehicle shall not load or unload for longer than 30 minutes in the same place in total and shall not wait for longer than 10 minutes in the same place without goods or merchandise being loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

Penalty Charge

Waiting restrictions

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 4.

Loading or unloading restrictions

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload during Monday to Friday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm, in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 4.

Exemptions from waiting restrictions

3. Nothing in Article 1 hereof shall:-
 - (i) Prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes;

Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to load or unload in the lengths of road referred to in that Article, outwith Monday to Friday, 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm, for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of the carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway. The vehicle shall not load or unload for longer than 30 minutes in the same place in total and shall not wait for longer than 10 minutes in the same place without goods or merchandise being loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

Penalty Charge

Loading or unloading restrictions

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload at any time in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 5.

Exemptions from waiting and loading or unloading restrictions

3. Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 hereof shall:-
 - (i) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait, load or unload in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes;
 - (c) if the vehicle is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;
 - (d) if the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal postal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for the delivery or collection of postal packets;
 - (ii) apply to a pedal cycle attached to a stand which displays the sign corresponding to The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 diagram number 968 or 968.1;

Penalty Charge

4. (i) A penalty charge, as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is waiting on any length of road specified in Schedule 5 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1 to 3 hereof.

(ii) The penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.

Marking on the carriageway of bus parking places

2. (i) The limits of the bus parking place shall be indicated on the carriageway in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, or as specially authorised by The Scottish Ministers.
(ii) The lengths of bus parking places described in Schedule 26 are the maximum lengths. The on-road markings may show bus parking places reduced in length such as the Council may determine.

Vehicles for which bus parking places are designated

3. Each bus parking place designated in Schedule 26 may be used, subject to the provisions of these Articles pertaining to Schedule 26, for the leaving of buses only.

Manner of standing in bus parking places

4. Every vehicle left in a bus parking place shall stand such that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of that bus parking place provided under Article 2 hereof.

Alteration of position of vehicle in bus parking places

5. If any vehicle is standing in a bus parking place in contravention of the provisions of the Articles pertaining to this Schedule 26, a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position complies with those provisions.

Movement of vehicle from bus parking place in an emergency

6. Any person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, buses or vehicles left in a bus parking place.

Power to suspend bus parking places

- 7.(i) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a bus parking place or any part thereof whenever such suspension is considered reasonably necessary for the:-
 - a) purpose of facilitating the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or for promoting its safety or where the Council deems it necessary to facilitate a particular operation or event; or
 - b) purpose of any building or roadworks operation, or works associated with the provision or maintenance of public utilities, provided that prior permission has been granted by the Council, including works being done by the Council or on the Council's behalf.

Articles pertaining to Schedule 26
Bus parking places

- (ii) Any person suspending the use of a bus parking place or any part thereof in accordance with paragraph (i) of this Article shall indicate that the use of the bus parking place is suspended and that waiting by any vehicle is prohibited by erecting notices or a traffic sign indicating that the use of the bus parking place is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a bus parking place suspended in accordance with paragraph (ii) of this Article provided that nothing in this Article shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for emergency services purposes to be left in the bus parking place or if a vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the use of the bus parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (i) of this Article or a police constable in uniform.

Restriction of waiting of vehicles in bus parking places

8. Any vehicle may wait anywhere in a bus parking place if:-
- a) a vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident; or
 - b) the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes; or
 - c) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
 - d) the vehicle, not being a bus, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 7 (i) (b) hereof;

Provided that a person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a bus parking place by virtue of Article 8 hereof shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300mm.

Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.

Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.
11. If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 9 hereof, a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed. If it is removed the Council shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle. Where a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 9 hereof a period of 15 minutes shall elapse before the vehicle is removed.

Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

12. Subject to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed from a bus parking place in pursuance with Article 11 hereof, if it appears to them to have been abandoned, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle and to inform the owner of their intention.

Designation of parking places

1. Each area on a road which is described in Schedule 27 is designated as a parking place. During the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm charges apply. Outwith these times no charges apply.

Marking on the carriageway of parking places and parking spaces

2. (i) The limits of each parking space in a parking place shall be indicated on the carriageway in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, or as specially authorised by The Scottish Ministers.
(ii) The lengths of parking places described in Schedule 27 are the maximum lengths. The on-road markings may show parking places reduced in length such as the Council may determine.

Signing of parking places for use by resident parking permit holders

3. Parking places available for use by resident parking permit holders will be signed with one or more zone identifiers.

Vehicles for which parking places are designated

4. Each parking place designated in Schedule 27 may be used, subject to the provisions of these Articles pertaining to Schedule 27, for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, dual-purpose vehicles, motorcycles or disabled vehicles.

Manner of standing in parking places

5. Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand such that the whole vehicle is within the limits of a single parking space and each single parking space shall be occupied by a single vehicle only. Where a vehicle can not comply with this Article due to its length it shall park only within a parking space located at the end of the parking place such that its extreme front or rear portion is within 300mm of the indication on the carriageway provided under Article 2 hereof in relation to the parking space and the rest of the vehicle overhangs a waiting or loading restriction.

Alteration of position of vehicle in parking places

6. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 5 hereof a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position complies with those provisions.

Movement of vehicle from parking place in an emergency

7. Any person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, vehicles left in a parking place.

Meter feeding

8. Any vehicle which has been left in a parking place, must, after the expiration of the maximum parking time, be removed from that parking place. The maximum parking time in the parking place is as stated in Article 31 hereof and this time must not be exceeded. This applies during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm.

Power to suspend parking places

9. (i) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever such suspension is considered reasonably necessary for the:-
- a) purpose of facilitating the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or for promoting its safety or where the Council deems it necessary to facilitate a particular operation or event; or
 - b) purpose of any building or roadworks operations, or works associated with the provision or maintenance of public utilities, provided that prior permission has been granted by the Council, including works being done by the Council or on the Council's behalf; or
 - c) convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from such premises.
- (ii) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with paragraph (i) of this Article shall indicate that the use of the parking place is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited by:-
- a) placing or causing to be placed hoods or other covers over any parking ticket machine; and/or
 - b) affixing notices to the parking ticket machines or erecting notices indicating that the use of the parking place is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited; and/or
 - c) placing a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited;

No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking place suspended in accordance with paragraph (ii) of this Article provided that nothing in this Article shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for emergency services

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purposes to be left in the parking place, or if that vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (i) of this Article or a police constable in uniform.

Restriction of trading at parking places

10. No person shall use any vehicle or trailer, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale, or offering for sale, of any article to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity, or for the purpose of advertising.

Restriction of waiting of vehicles in parking places

11.(i) Any vehicle may wait anywhere in a parking place if:-

- a) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle; or
- b) a vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident; or
- c) the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes; or
- d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- e) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 9 (i) (b) hereof; or
- f) the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal postal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is waiting only for the delivery or collection of postal packets addressed to or from premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting.
- g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the delivery or removal of furniture to or from premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting.

Provided that a person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a parking place by virtue of Article 11 (i) (e) (f) or (g) hereof shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300mm.

Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.

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Amount of parking charge at parking places

12. Save as provided in Article 25 hereof, the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place designated in Schedule 27, during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be in accordance with the rates in Article 30 hereof and subject to a maximum parking time in accordance with Article 31 hereof.

Method of payment of parking charge

- 13.(i) The parking charge as specified in Article 30 hereof shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place. Payment shall be made by using the parking ticket machine and using the method of payment accepted by the parking ticket machine, and;
- (ii) The driver, or person authorised by the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (iii), (iv) and (v) of this Article, the parking ticket issued by the parking ticket machine at the time of payment;
- (iii) A parking ticket shall be valid for a single stay only and no other parking ticket issued by any parking ticket machine shall be displayed;
- (iv) The parking ticket shall be exhibited on the vehicle: -
- a) in the case of a two-wheeled motor cycle having a sidecar attached thereto, or any other vehicle not having a windscreen, in a conspicuous position on the near side of the vehicle in front of the driving seat;
 - b) in the case of any other vehicle, in a conspicuous position facing forward on the inside of the glass of the windscreen.
- (v) The parking ticket shall be so exhibited on the vehicle so that the time and other details indicated on the front thereof are clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.

Indications by parking tickets

- 14.(i) Payment of the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place designated in Article 30 hereof shall be indicated by a parking ticket issued from a parking ticket machine at or near the parking place. This parking ticket shall be numbered to indicate the identity of the issuing machine. It will identify the amount of parking charge that has been paid and the date and time of payment or the amount of parking charge that has been paid and the date and time when the permitted parking in terms of the parking ticket will expire. Exhibition of any parking ticket shall be in accordance with the provisions of Article 13 hereof;
- (ii) The expiry of the period for which the parking charge has been paid shall take place when the time shown on the clock on the parking ticket machine is later than the expiry time shown on the parking ticket.

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- (iii) If the parking ticket machine, at the parking place at which the vehicle is left, is out of order, an alternative machine must be used. The alternative machine shall display the same parking charge tariffs and maximum parking time as the machine nearest the parking place in which the vehicle is left.

Indications by parking ticket machines and parking tickets as evidence of Permitted Parking

- 15.(i) If a vehicle is left in a parking place and no parking ticket or resident parking permit is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Articles 14 and 17 hereof it shall be presumed that the parking charge has not been duly paid;
- (ii) If a vehicle is left in a parking place and the clock on the parking ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left and the parking ticket exhibited on the vehicle and issued from the parking ticket machine gives the indication mentioned in Article 14 (ii) hereof, it shall be presumed that the parking charge has been duly paid and that the period for which payment was made by the parking charge has already expired.

Resident Parking Permits

- 16.(i) Subject to Articles 17 to 22 inclusive, hereof, resident parking permits shall be available for purchase at the prices specified in Article 32 hereof, by any person who ordinarily resides at an address within the boundary of Zones L, M, N and S, as defined on the plan in Schedule 54.
 - (ii) Each resident parking permit issued shall incorporate 1 or more of the zone identifiers, L, M, N or S, indicated on the plan in Schedule 54.
17. The resident parking permit shall be displayed on the nearside of the vehicle, behind the glass of the windscreen, in such a position as to ensure that the front side of the resident parking permit is clearly visible and legible to any person standing at the front or nearside of the vehicle.
18. Any vehicle which displays a resident parking permit, in the manner specified in Article 17 hereof, may be left during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm within a parking place signed with a zone identifier corresponding to that on the resident parking permit without payment of the parking charge as defined in Article 12 hereof.

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Articles pertaining to Schedule 27
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19. As regards the issue of resident parking permits:-

- (i) application for a resident parking permit shall be made in a manner determined by the Council and the applicant shall provide such information as the Council may require in order to verify that the issue of a resident parking permit will be valid; and
- (ii) the Council, on being satisfied that the applicant has provided the information required in paragraph (i) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant on payment of the sum detailed in Article 32 hereof a resident parking permit to be used as outlined in Articles 17 and 18 hereof.

The Council may, upon giving 28 days notice in writing served on the resident parking permit holder at the address shown on the application for the resident parking permit, or at such other address believed to be the resident parking permit holders residence at the time, withdraw a resident parking permit if:-

- (i) the resident parking permit holder ceases to be a resident at the address for which the resident parking permit was issued.
- (ii) the Council issues a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit under the provision of Article 22 hereof.

22. A duplicate or replacement resident parking permit may be issued on application if:-

- (i) a resident parking permit is mutilated or defaced or faded and is illegible then the resident parking permit holder shall surrender the resident parking permit to the Council and shall apply for issue under Article 19 (i) hereof, of a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit which, when issued on payment of an administration fee as specified in Article 33 hereof, shall render the original resident parking permit invalid; or
- (ii) a resident parking permit is lost or destroyed, and the resident parking permit holder applies to the Council for the issue of a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit under Article 19 (i) hereof and paragraph (i) of this Article; or

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(iii) a resident parking permit holder ceases to be the owner of the vehicle for which the resident parking permit was originally issued. The resident parking permit holder shall then surrender their resident parking permit and may apply for issue under Article 19 (i) hereof of a replacement resident parking permit in respect of any new vehicle at no further charge, such replacement resident parking permit rendering the original resident parking permit invalid.

23. The provisions of Articles 16 to 22 inclusive hereof shall apply equally to a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit as for an original resident parking permit.

Indications by resident parking permits as evidence

24. Subject to the provisions of Article 13, if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no valid resident parking permit is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Articles 17 and 18 hereof, it shall be presumed that a parking charge is due and has not been duly paid.

Exemption from parking charges

25. A disabled vehicle left during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm in a parking place designated in Schedule 27 shall be exempt from the parking charges specified in Article 30 hereof.

Penalty Charge

26.(i) A penalty charge as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is left in a parking place designated in Schedule 27 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 4, 5 and 8 to 25 inclusive hereof.

(ii) The amount of the penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.

(iii) A penalty charge notice shall be attached to the vehicle, or handed to the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, incurring the penalty charge.

27. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 26 (iii) hereof, no person, other than the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle. Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.

If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 26 hereof a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed. Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

Pay and display parking charges

30. The parking charge for each 12 minute stay is 10 pence, as amended from time to time by notice.

Maximum parking time

31. The maximum time that a vehicle is permitted to park in a parking space during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm, is 4 hours.

Resident parking permit charges

32. The resident parking permit charge is £250 annually or £65 quarterly, as amended from time to time by notice.

Administration Fee

33. The administration fee for the withdrawal of a resident parking permit or for the replacement of a lost or damaged resident parking permit shall be £20, as amended from time to time by notice.

Manner of standing in parking places

Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand such that the whole vehicle is within the limits of a single parking space and each single parking space shall be occupied by a single vehicle only. Where a vehicle can not comply with this Article due to its length it shall park only within a parking space located at the end of the parking place such that its extreme front or rear portion is within 300mm of the indication on the carriageway provided under Article 2 hereof in relation to the parking space and the rest of the vehicle overhangs a waiting or loading restriction.

Alteration of position of vehicle in parking places

6. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 5 hereof a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position complies with those provisions.

- d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- e) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 9 (i) (b) hereof; or

4. Each parking place designated in Schedule 29 may be used, subject to the provisions of these Articles pertaining to Schedule 29, for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, dual-purpose vehicles, or motorcycles or disabled vehicles.

Manner of standing in parking places

5. Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand such that the whole vehicle is within the limits of a single parking space and each single parking space shall be occupied by a single vehicle only. Where a vehicle can not comply with this Article due to its length it shall park only within a parking space located at the end of the parking place such that its extreme front or rear portion is within 300mm of the indication on the carriageway provided under Article 2 hereof in relation to the parking space and the rest of the vehicle overhangs a waiting or loading restriction.

Alteration of position of vehicle in parking places

6. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 5 hereof a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position complies with those provisions.

Movement of vehicle from parking place in an emergency

7. Any person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, vehicles left in a parking place.

Meter feeding

8. Any vehicle which has been left in a parking place, must, after the expiration of the maximum parking time, be removed from that parking place. The maximum parking time in the parking place is as stated in Article 31 hereof and this time must not be exceeded. This applies during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm.

Power to suspend parking places

- 9.(i) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever such suspension is considered reasonably necessary for the:-
- a) purpose of facilitating the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or for promoting its safety or where the Council deems it necessary to facilitate a particular operation or event; or
 - b) purpose of any building or roadworks operations, or works associated with the provision or maintenance of public utilities, provided that prior permission has been granted by the Council, including works being done by the Council or on the Council's behalf; or
 - c) convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from such premises.
- (ii) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with paragraph (i) of this Article shall indicate that the use of the spaces is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited by:-
- a) placing or causing to be placed hoods or other covers over any parking ticket machine; and/or
 - b) affixing notices to the parking ticket machines or erecting notices indicating that the use of the spaces is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited; and/or
 - c) placing a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited;

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No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking space suspended in accordance with paragraph (ii) of this Article provided that nothing in this Article shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for emergency services purposes to be left in the parking place, or if that vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (i) of this Article or a police constable in uniform.

Restriction of trading at parking places

10. No person shall use any vehicle or trailer, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale or offering for sale of any article to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity, or for the purpose of advertising.

Restriction of waiting of vehicles in parking places

11.(i) Any vehicle may wait anywhere in a parking place if:-

- a) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle; or
- b) a vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident; or
- c) the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes; or
- d) the vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- e) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 9 (i) (b) hereof; or
- f) the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal postal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is waiting only for the delivery or collection of postal packets addressed to or from premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting; or
- g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the delivery or removal of furniture to or from premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting.

Provided that a person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a parking place by virtue of Article 11 (i) (e) (f) or (g) hereof shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300mm.

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Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.

Amount of parking charge at parking places

12. Save as provided in Article 25 hereof, the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place designated in Schedule 29, during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be in accordance with the rates in Article 30 hereof and subject to a maximum parking time in accordance with Article 31 hereof.

Method of payment of parking charge

- 13.(i) The parking charge as specified in Article 30 hereof shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place. Payment shall be made using the parking ticket machine and using the method of payment accepted by the parking ticket machine, and;
- (ii) The driver, or person authorised by the driver of the vehicle, shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (iii), (iv) and (v) of this Article, the parking ticket issued by the parking ticket machine at the time of payment;
 - (iii) A parking ticket shall be valid for a single stay only and no other parking ticket issued by any parking ticket machine shall be displayed;
 - (iv) The parking ticket shall be exhibited on the vehicle: -
 - a) in the case of a two-wheeled motorcycle having a sidecar attached thereto, or any other vehicle not having a windscreen, in a conspicuous position on the near side of the vehicle in front of the driving seat;
 - b) in the case of any other vehicle, in a conspicuous position facing forward on the inside of the glass of the windscreen.
 - (v) The parking ticket shall be so exhibited on the vehicle so that the time and other details indicated on the front thereof are clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.

Indications by parking tickets

14.(i) Payment of the parking charge for a vehicle left in a parking place designated in Article 30 hereof shall be indicated by a parking ticket issued from a parking ticket machine at or near the parking place. This parking ticket shall be numbered to indicate the identity of the issuing machine. It will identify the amount of parking charge that has been paid and the date and time of payment or the amount of parking charge that has been paid and the date and time when the permitted parking in terms of the parking ticket will expire. Exhibition of any parking ticket shall be in accordance with the provisions of Article 13 hereof;

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- (ii) The expiry of the period for which the parking charge has been paid shall take place when the time shown on the clock on the parking ticket machine is later than the expiry time shown on the parking ticket.
- (iii) If the parking ticket machine, at the parking place at which the vehicle is left, is out of order an alternative machine must be used. The alternative machine shall display the same parking charge tariffs and maximum parking time as the machine nearest the parking place in which the vehicle is left.

Indications by parking ticket machines and parking tickets as evidence of Permitted Parking

- 15.(i) If a vehicle is left in a parking place and no parking ticket or resident parking ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Articles 14 and 17 hereof it shall be presumed that the parking charge has not been duly paid;
- (ii) If a vehicle is left in a parking place the clock on the parking ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left and the parking ticket exhibited on the vehicle and issued from the parking ticket machine gives the indication mentioned in Article 14 (ii) hereof, it shall be presumed that the parking charge has been duly paid and that the period for which payment was made by the parking charge has already expired.

Resident Parking Permits

- 16.(i) Subject to Articles 17 to 22 inclusive, hereof, resident parking permits shall be available for purchase at the prices specified in Article 32 hereof, by any person who ordinarily resides at an address within the boundary of Zones B, C, D, E, F and M as defined on the plan in Schedule 54.
 - (ii) Each resident parking permit issued shall incorporate 1 or more of the zone identifiers B, C, D, E, F and M, indicated on the plan in Schedule 54.
17. The resident parking permit shall be displayed on the nearside of the vehicle, behind the glass of the windscreen, in such a position as to ensure that the front side of the resident parking permit is clearly visible and legible to any person standing at the front or nearside of the vehicle.
18. Any vehicle which displays a resident parking permit, in the manner specified in Article 17 hereof, may be left during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm within a parking place signed with a zone identifier corresponding to that on the resident parking permit without payment of the parking charge as defined in Article 12 hereof.

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19. As regards the issue of resident parking permits:-

- (i) application for a resident parking permit shall be made in a manner determined by the Council and the applicant shall provide such information as the Council may require in order to verify that the issue of a resident parking permit will be valid; and
- (ii) the Council, on being satisfied that the applicant has provided the information required in paragraph (i) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant on payment of the sum detailed in Article 32 hereof, a resident parking permit to be used as outlined in Articles 17 and 18 hereof.
- (iii) No person shall be issued with a resident parking permit if that person resides in a dwellinghouse created (by new-build or redevelopment) on or after 1 January 2000.

20. A resident parking permit may be surrendered by the holder to the Council at any time and a refund will be given for the unused complete months on a pro rata basis, less the administration fee as specified in Article 33 hereof, unless the resident parking permit holder no longer lives at the address for which the resident parking permit was issued, in which case the administration fee shall be waived.

21. The Council may, upon giving 28 days notice in writing served on the resident parking permit holder at the address shown on the application for the resident parking permit, or at such other address believed to be the resident parking permit holders residence at the time, withdraw a resident parking permit if:-

- (i) the resident parking permit holder ceases to be a resident at the address for which the resident parking permit was issued.
- (ii) the Council issues a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit under the provision of Article 22 hereof.

22. A duplicate or replacement resident parking permit may be issued on application if:-

- (i) a resident parking permit is mutilated or defaced or faded and is illegible then the resident parking permit holder shall surrender the resident parking permit to the Council and shall apply for issue under Article 19 (i) hereof, of a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit which, when issued on payment of an administration fee as specified in Article 33 hereof, shall render the original resident parking permit invalid; or
- (ii) a resident parking permit is lost or destroyed, and the permit holder applies to the Council for the issue of a duplicate or replacement permit under Article 19 (i) hereof and paragraph (i) of this Article; or

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(iii) a resident parking permit holder ceases to be the owner of the vehicle for which the resident parking permit was originally issued. The resident parking permit holder shall then surrender their resident parking permit and may apply for issue under Article 19 (i) hereof of a replacement resident parking permit in respect of any new vehicle at no further charge, such replacement resident parking permit rendering the original resident parking permit invalid.

23. The provisions of Articles 16 to 22 inclusive hereof shall apply equally to a duplicate or replacement resident parking permit as for an original resident parking permit.

Indications by resident parking permits as evidence

24. Subject to the provisions of Article 13, if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no valid resident parking permit is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Articles 17 and 18 hereof, it shall be presumed that a parking charge is due and has not been duly paid.

Exemption from charges

25. A disabled vehicle left during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm in a parking place designated in Schedule 29 shall be exempt from the parking charges specified in Article 30 hereof.

Penalty Charge

26.(i) A penalty charge as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is left in a parking place designated in Schedule 29 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 4, 5 and 8 to 25 inclusive hereof.

(ii) The amount of the penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.

(iii) A penalty charge notice shall be attached to the vehicle, or handed to the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, incurring the penalty charge.

27. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 26 (iii) hereof, no person, other than the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle. Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.

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28. If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 26 hereof a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed. If it is removed, the Council shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle. If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 26 hereof a period of 15 minutes shall elapse before the vehicle is removed.

Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

29. Subject to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, the Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed from a parking place in pursuance with Article 28 hereof, if it appears to them to have been abandoned, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle and to inform the owner of their intention.

Pay and display parking charges

30. The parking charge for each 15 minute stay is 50 pence. If paying using the mobile phone option the parking charges are £2 for 1 hour and £4 for 2 hours. The transaction fee is 30 pence and a text reminder is 20 pence. The parking charges and other fees may be amended from time to time by notice.

Maximum parking time

31. The maximum time that a vehicle is permitted to park in a parking space during the hours of Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm is 2 hours.

Resident parking permit charges

32. The resident parking permit is £250 annually or £65 quarterly as amended from time to time by notice.

Administration Fee

33. The administration fee for the withdrawal of a resident parking permit or for the replacement of a lost or damaged resident parking permit shall be £20, as amended from time to time by notice.

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No Waiting during Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm
No Loading or unloading

Waiting restrictions

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 30.

Loading or unloading restrictions

2. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload during Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 30.

Exemptions from waiting restrictions

3. Nothing in Article 1 hereof shall:-
 - (i) Prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in this Article:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load or unload his or her personal luggage;
 - (b) if the vehicle is an emergency services vehicle being used for emergency services purposes;
 - (c) if the vehicle is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;
 - (d) if the vehicle is a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a Universal Postal Service Provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is waiting only for the delivery or collection of postal packets;
 - (e) outwith Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm provided it complies with Articles 5 to 27 hereof;
 - (ii) apply to a pedal cycle attached to a stand which displays the sign corresponding to The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 diagram number 968 or 968.1.

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during Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm

Exemptions from loading or unloading restrictions

4. Nothing in Article 2 hereof shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to load or unload in the lengths of road referred to in that Article outwith Monday to Saturday 8am to 9.15am and 4.15pm to 6pm for the delivery or collection of goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road. The vehicle must stand on the carriageway such that its front and rear wheels nearest to the edge of the carriageway are not more than 300mm from the edge of the carriageway. The vehicle shall not load or unload for longer than 30 minutes in the same place in total and shall not wait for longer than 10 minutes in the same place without goods or merchandise being loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

Designation of parking places

5. Each area on a road which is described in Schedule 30 is designated as a parking place during the hours of Monday to Saturday 9.15am to 4.15pm and during the hours of Monday to Saturday 6pm to Midnight and Midnight to 8am and all day Sunday. During the hours of Monday to Saturday 9.15am to 4.15pm parking charges apply. During the hours of Monday to Saturday 6pm to Midnight and Midnight to 8am and all day Sunday, parking charges do not apply.

Marking on the carriageway of parking places and parking spaces

6. (i) The limits of each parking space in a parking place shall be indicated on the carriageway in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, or as specially authorised by The Scottish Ministers.
(ii) The lengths of parking places described in Schedule 30 are the maximum lengths. The on-road markings may show parking places reduced in length such as the Council may determine.

Vehicles for which parking places are designated

7. Each parking place designated in Schedule 30 may be used, subject to the provisions of these Articles pertaining to Schedule 30, for the leaving of passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, dual-purpose vehicles, motorcycles or disabled vehicles.

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Manner of standing in parking places

8. Every vehicle left in a parking place shall stand such that the whole vehicle is within the limits of a single parking space and each single parking space shall be occupied by a single vehicle only. Where a vehicle can not comply with this Article due to its length it shall park only within a parking space located at the end of the parking place such that its extreme front or rear portion is within 300mm of the indication on the carriageway provided under Article 6 hereof in relation to the parking space and the rest of the vehicle overhangs a waiting or loading restriction.

Alteration of position of vehicle in parking places

9. Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 8 hereof a parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position complies with those provisions.

Movement of vehicle from parking place in an emergency

10. Any person duly authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, vehicles left in a parking place.

Meter feeding

11. Any vehicle which has been left in a parking place, must, after the expiration of the maximum parking time, be removed from that parking place. The maximum parking time in the parking place is as stated in Article 27 hereof and this time must not be exceeded. This applies during the hours of Monday to Saturday 9.15am to 4.15pm.

Power to suspend parking places

- 12.(i) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever such suspension is considered reasonably necessary for the:-
- a) purpose of facilitating the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or for promoting its safety or where the Council deems it necessary to facilitate a particular operation or event; or

Method of payment of parking charge

- 16.(i) The parking charge as specified in Article 26 hereof shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place. Payment shall be made by using the parking ticket machine and using the method of payment accepted by the parking ticket machine, and;
- (ii) The driver, or person authorised by the driver of the vehicle shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (iii), (iv) and (v) of this Article, the parking ticket issued by the parking ticket machine at the time of payment;
- (iii) A parking ticket shall be valid for a single stay only and no other parking ticket issued by any parking ticket machine shall be displayed;
- (iv) The parking ticket shall be exhibited on the vehicle: -

- (iii) If the parking ticket machine, at the parking place at which the vehicle is left, is out of order an alternative machine must be used. The alternative machine shall display the same parking charge tariffs and maximum parking time as the machine nearest the parking place in which the vehicle is left.

Indications by parking ticket machines and parking tickets as evidence of Permitted Parking

- 18.(i) If a vehicle is left in a parking place and no parking ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 hereof it shall be presumed that the parking charge has not been duly paid;
- (ii) If a vehicle is left in a parking place and the clock on the parking ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left and the parking ticket exhibited on the vehicle and issued from the parking ticket machine gives the indication mentioned in Article 17 (ii) hereof, it shall be presumed that the parking charge has been duly paid and that the period for which payment was made by the parking charge has already expired.

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Exemption from charges

19. A disabled vehicle left during the hours of Monday to Saturday 9.15am to 4.15pm in a parking place designated in Schedule 30, by the driver thereof, shall be exempt from the parking charges specified in Article 26 hereof.

Penalty Charge

20. A penalty charge as permitted by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, shall be payable, with respect to a vehicle, if that vehicle is waiting on any length of road designated in Schedule 30 otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1 to 8 and 11 to 19 hereof.
21. The amount of the penalty charge shall be £60, discounted to £30 if paid within 14 days and £90 if unpaid after 56 days, as amended from time to time.
22. A penalty charge notice shall be attached to the vehicle, or handed to the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, incurring the penalty charge.
23. Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 22 hereof, no person, other than the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle, or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the penalty charge notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner or person who appears to be in charge of the vehicle. Any person who removes a penalty charge notice without the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence in terms of Section 66(6) of the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended.
24. If a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Articles 20 to 22 hereof a parking attendant may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed from a parking place. If it is removed, the Council shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle. Where a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with Article 20 to 22 hereof, a period of 15 minutes shall elapse before the vehicle is removed.

Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

25. Subject to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed in accordance with Article 24 hereof, if it appears to have been abandoned, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle and to inform the owner of their intention.

Pay and display parking charges

26. The parking charge for each 15 minute stay is 50 pence. If paying using the mobile phone payment option the charges are £2 for 1 hour and £4 for 2 hours. The transaction fee is 30 pence and a text reminder is 20 pence. These charges are amended from time to time by notice.

Maximum parking time

27. The maximum time that a vehicle is permitted to park in a parking space during the hours of Monday to Saturday 9.15am to 4.15pm is 2 hours.
