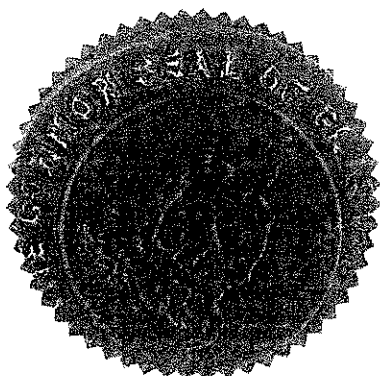
(TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2007

Glasgow City Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon it under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order.

This Order may be cited as the "Glasgow City Council (Spiersgate) (Traffic Management) (Amendment) Order 2007" and shall come into operation on 1 August 2007.

1. The Orders specified in Schedule 1 to this Order shall have the effect subject to the amendments specified in that Schedule.

<u>Name of Order</u>	<u>Extent of Amendment</u>
Glasgow City Council (Spiersgate) (Traffic Management) Order 2005	<p>In Article 3 amend the following:-</p> <p>“Administration Fee” to read “means the charge for the replacement of a lost or damaged Resident Parking Permit, Business Parking Permit”</p> <p>“Permitted Hours” to read “means in relation to resident parking permits, business parking permits”</p> <p>In Article 3 add the following:-</p> <p>“Business Parking Permit” means a badge or disc issued by the Council, in accordance with the provisions of this Order.</p> <p>In Article 28(iii)</p> <p>amend the word “redevelopment” to read:- “conversion”</p> <p>Add the following Articles:-</p> <p>28.(v) Nothing in Clause (iii) of this Article shall preclude the issue of a permit to a resident of a dwelling created by the conversion of a building constructed prior to 1 January 2000 where, within 100 metres of that dwelling, a minimum of three parking bays are routinely unoccupied during the permitted hours.</p> <p>48.(i) Subject to Articles 49 to 54 inclusive of this Order business parking permits shall be available for purchase at the prices specified in Schedule 8, by any business located within the boundary as defined on the plan in Schedule 9.</p> <p>(ii) Each business parking permit issued shall incorporate the zone identifier indicated on the plan in Schedule 9.</p> <p>49. The business parking permit shall be displayed on the nearside of the vehicle, behind the glass of the windscreen, in such a position as to ensure that the front side of the permit is clearly visible to any person standing at the front or nearside of the vehicle.</p> <p>50. Any vehicle which displays a business parking permit, in the manner specified in Article 49 of this Order, may be left during the permitted hours within a parking place signed with a zone identifier corresponding to that on the permit without incurring the initial charge as defined in Article 21 of this Order.</p>

SCHEDULE 1

ORDERS TO BE AMENDED

Add the following Articles:-

51. As regards the issue of business parking permits:-
- (i) application for a business parking permit shall be made in a manner determined by the Council and the applicant shall provide such information as the Council may require in order to verify that the issue of a permit will be valid; and
 - (ii) the Council, on being satisfied that the applicant has provided the information required in paragraph (i) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant on payment of the sum detailed in Schedule 8 to this Order a business parking permit to be used as defined in Articles 49 and 50, provided that at no time the total number of business permits issued shall exceed 80% of X , where X is 90% of the number of parking bays detailed in Schedule 3 to this Order less the number of residents' permits in circulation, in accordance with Article 28 of this Order.
52. A business parking permit may be surrendered by the holder to the Council at any time and a refund will be given for the unused complete months on a pro rata basis, less the administrative fee as specified in Schedule 8 to this Order.
53. The Council may, giving 28 days notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown on the application for the permit, withdraw a permit if:-
- (i) the business to whom the parking permit was issued ceases to be located within the boundary as defined on the plan in Schedule 9
 - (ii) the Council issues a duplicate or replacement permit under the provision of Article 54 of this Order.
54. A duplicate or replacement permit may be issued on application if:-
- (i) a permit is mutilated or defaced or faded so that the identifying mark as referred to in Article 48 (ii) of this Order is illegible when the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council and shall apply for issue under paragraph (i) of Article 51, of this Order of a duplicate or replacement permit which, when issued on payment of an administration fee as specified in Schedule 8 to this Order, shall render the original permit invalid; or
 - (ii) a permit is lost or destroyed, when the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate or replacement permit under paragraph (i) Article 51 of this Order and paragraph (i) of this Article.
55. The provisions of Articles 48 to 54 inclusive of this Order shall apply equally to a duplicate or replacement business parking permit as for an original permit.

And add

Business Permits

£700 per annum	No limit subject to available space	No limit

Add to "Administration Fee"

The administration fee for the withdrawal of a business parking permit or for the replacement of a lost or damaged business parking permit shall be £20.00
