The Glasgow City Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1(1), 1(2), 2(1) to (3), 32, 35, 45, 46 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("The Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act hereby make the following Order:

#### PART I GENERAL

#### Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as "The Glasgow City Council (Gorbals Street, Pollokshaws Road, Victoria Road, etc.) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1997 and shall come into operation on Sunday, the Twenty seventh day of July Nineteen hundred and ninety Seven.

#### Interpretation

(a) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"Chief Constable" means the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police;

"contra-flow bus lane" means the area of the carriageway of a road specified in Schedule 8 to this Order lying between the edge of the carriageway and the longitudinal white line placed on the carriageway in accordance with Diagram 1049 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"contra flow cycle lane" means the area of the carriageway of a road specified in Schedule 9 to this Order lying between the edge of the carriageway and the longitudinal white the placed on the carriageway in accordance with Diagram 1049 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"Council" means The Glasgow City Council;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as is given to the expression in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as is given to the expression in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 1991;

"dual-purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as is given to the expression in Regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;

"emergency service vehicle" means any vehicle for the time being in use by the Police, Fire Service, Ambulance Service or Civil Defence organisation;

"goods vehicle" means any vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the conveyance of goods or burden of any description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted, but not including a dual-purpose vehicle;

"local bus" means any bus in use for the time being for the provision of a local service;

"local service" has the same meaning as is given to the expression in the Transport Act 1985;

"parking attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place;

"parking place" means an area of carriageway of a road designated as a parking place by Article 22 of this Order;

"parking ticket meter" means an apparatus designed to indicate the time externally and to issue tickets for a fee indicating the payment of the fee, the period in respect of which it has been paid and the day and time at which it was paid;

"pedal cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle, or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

"public holiday" for the purposes of this Order is deemed to mean Christmas Day (and the Monday following should that day fall on a Sunday) and New Years Day (and the Monday following should that day fall on a Sunday);

"relevant position" has the same meaning as in section 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 1971;

"restricted hours" means the period between 7.00am and 7.00pm on Mondays to Sundays inclusive other than on a public holiday;

"restricted road" means any road or part of road specified in Schedule 10 to this Order;

"school bus" means a vehicle constructed to carry 8 or more passengers and being used to carry persons to or from a school as defined in the Education (Scotland) Act 1980;

"taxi" means a taxi licensed under section 10 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;

"telegraphic line" has the same meaning as is given to the expression in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"traffic warden" means a traffic warden employed by a police authority in pursuance of section 9 of the Police (Scotland) Act, 1967 as read with sections 95 and 96 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984;

"vehicle" means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along a road whether or not by mechanical power;

"waiting," means when a vehicle and/or any trailer attached thereto at the time the vehicle first came to rest remains at rest for any finite period above any specific point in a road whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period; and

"with-flow bus lane" means the area of the carriageway of a road specified in Schedule 7 to this Order lying between the edge of the carriageway and the longitudinal white line placed on the carriageway in accordance with Diagram 1049 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994.

- (b) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- (c) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

### PART II CERTAIN LENGTHS OF ROAD TO BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC

## Prohibition of Driving other than pedal cycles

No person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a pedal cycle on any length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

# PART III CERTAIN ROADS TO BE RESTRICTED TO ONE WAY TRAFFIC

Traffic movements restricted to one direction

No person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle on a length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Order otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such length of road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

# Traffic movements restricted to one direction except for buses, taxis and pedal cycles

Save as provided in Article 15 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a local bus, a school bus, a taxi or a pedal cycle on a length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such length of road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

## Traffic movements restricted to one direction except for pedal cycles

No person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a pedal cycle on a length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 4 to this Order otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such length of road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

# PART IV RESTRICTIONS ON RIGHT OR LEFT TURN MOVEMENTS

#### Prohibition of Right Turns

Save as provided in Article 15 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle on the road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 5 to this Order so as to make a Righthand turn into the road specified opposite to such road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

#### Prohibition of Left Turns

Save as provided in Article 15 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle on the road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 6 to this Order so as to make a Left-hand turn into the road specified opposite to such road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

# PART V CERTAIN ROADS TO HAVE WITH-FLOW BUS LANES

## Restrictions on use of Certain Areas of Carriageway

Save as provided in Articles 15, 18(a) to (e), 18(g) and 19 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a local bus, a school bus, a taxi or a pedal cycle such that it enters or proceeds along, or cause or permit any vehicle to wait within, a withflow bus lane specified in Schedule 7 to this Order.

#### PART VI CLARTAIN ROADS TO HAVE CONTRA-FLOW BUS LANES

## Restrictions on see of Certain Areas of Carriageway

Save as provided in Articles 15, 18(a) to (e), 18(g) and 19 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a local bus, a school bus, a taxi or a pedal cycle such that it enters or proceeds along, or cause or permit any vehicle to wait within, a contra-flow bus lane specified in Schedule 8 to this Order.

#### Use of Contra-flow Bus Lanes

Save as provided in Article 15 of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle within a contra-flow bus lane other than in the opposite direction to the permitted flow of traffic as specified in Column 2 of Schedule 3 to this Order.

## Compulsory use of Contra-flow Bus Lanes

Subject to the terms of Article 10 above no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle, proceeding in the opposite direction to the permitted flow of traffic as specified in Column 2 of Schedule 3 to this Order, other than within the contra-flow bus lane.

#### PART VII CERTAIN ROADS TO HAVE CONTRA-FLOW CYCLE LANES

#### Restrictions on use of Certain Areas of Carriageway

Save as provided in Articles 15, 18(b), 18(c) and 18(e) of this Order no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle other than a pedal cycle such that it enters or proceeds along, or cause or permit any vehicle to wait within, a contra-flow cycle lane specified in Schedule 9 to this Order.

#### Compulsory use of Contra-flow Cycle Lanes

Subject to the terms of Article 13 above no person shall drive or permit or cause to be driven any vehicle, proceeding in the opposite direction to the permitted flow of traffic as specified in Column 2 of Schedule 4 to this Order, other than within the contra-flow cycle lane.

## **Exemptions to Restricted Movements in Emergency**

- Nothing in Articles 5, 7, 8, 9, 10 or 13 of this Order shall apply so as to prohibit the movement described therein:-
  - (a) by any emergency service vehicle; or
  - (b) on the instruction of a police constable in uniform; or
  - by any vehicle in the service of the local roads authority whilst being used in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
  - (d) by any vehicle required for use or being used for the removal of an obstruction to traffic.

### PART VIII WAITING, I OADING AND UNLOADING OF VEHICLES IN CERTAIN ROADS

#### Prohibition of waiting, loading or unloading of vehicles

Save as provided in Articles 18 and 19 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the roads specified in Schedule 10 to this Order.

#### Restrictions on waiting of vehicles

Save as provided in Articles 18, 19, 20 and 21 of this Order no person shall, except on the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait during the restricted hours for a period greater than 10 (ten) minutes, or if a period of less than 50 (fifty) minutes has elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting, if any, of the vehicle in that road, in any length of road specified in Schedule 11 to this Order.

#### Exemption from waiting restrictions

- Nothing in Articles 9, 10, 13, 16 and 17 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any road referred to in Schedules 7, 8, 9, 10, or 11 to this Order:-
  - (a) for so long as may be necessary to enable a person or persons to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage; or
  - (b) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operations or demolition, or excavation in or adjacent to any road, the removal of an obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement, repair or reconstruction of the fabric of the road or of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line; or
  - if the vehicle is an emergency service vehicle, or any vehicle in the service of the local roads authority, in either case being used in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
  - (d) if the vehicle is a taxi waiting on a authorised taxi rank; or
  - (e) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary to avoid an accident; or
  - if the vehicle (being a vehicle in the service of the Post Office) is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered, or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to that road; or
  - (g) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with funeral operations;

## Furniture removal and other exceptional loading or unloading

- Nothing in Articles 9, 10, 16 and 17 of this Order shall apply so as to restrict the loading or unloading of a vehicle while the vehicle is in actual use in connection with:
  - (a) the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository; or
  - the coelection or delivery of goods which cannot reasonably be loaded or unloaded outwith the prohibited hours provided that at least 48 (forty-eight) hours notice is given to the Chief Constable, his consent is obtained, and any such conditions as he may impose are complied with.

#### Loading or unloading of goods

Nothing in Article 17 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a goods vehicle to wait in any restricted road for as long as may be necessary for the purpose of collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road provided that:-

- if the road is not restricted to one way traffic, the vehicle stands on the carriageway alongs are not more than 300 (three hundred) mm from the edge of the carriageway; or
- (b) if the road is restricted to one-way traffic the vehicle stands on the carriageway such that its wheels on one side of the vehicle or the other are not more than 300 (three hundred) mm from the adjacent edge of the carriageway; or
- (c) if the road does not have a defined edge of carriageway, the vehicle stands within a defined loading bay marked on the surface of the road and defined as such;
- (d) no such vehicle waits for a longer period than 10 (ten) minutes without goods being loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (e) no such vehicle waits for a longer period than 30 (thirty) minutes; and that
- (f) notwithstanding anything in the above paragraphs of this Article, the driver of a vehicle shall move the same on the instruction of a police constable in uniform whenever such moving may reasonably be necessary for the purpose of preventing an obstruction.

### **Exemption for Disabled Persons**

Nothing in Article 17 of this Order shall apply so as to prohibit any Disabled Person's Vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position to wait in any restricted road subject to the provisions of Article 20(a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) of this Order.

## PART IX PARKING PLACES

#### Designation of parking places

Each area on the carriageway of a road which is described as a designated parking place in Schedule 12 to this Order is designated as a parking place.

#### Marking on the carriageway of parking places

The limits of each parking place shall be indicated on the carriageway in such a manner as the Council may determine by lines or studs or other indications.

## Vehicles for which parking places are designated

Each parking place designated by this Order may be used, subject to the provisions of this part of the Order, for the leaving of motor vehicles during the restricted hours.

#### Amount of initial charges at parking places

The initial charge for a vehicle left in a parking place designated by this Order during the restricted hours shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be as specified in Schedule 13(A) to this Order.

## Payment of initial charge and requirements for exhibition of ticket

- The initial charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place by the initial charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place by the initial on of a coin, or coins inserted immediately one after the other, of the denomination or denominations listed in Schedule 13(C) to this Order, and the display of the resultant issued ticket in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of this Article;
  - b) Upon payment of the initial charge for a vehicle left in a parking place restricted hours the driver thereof shall exhibit the ticket issued by the parking ticket meter at the time of payment on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (c), (d), (e) and (f) of this Article;
  - The ticket shall be valid for a single stay only and no other ticket issued by a parking ticket meter shall be displayed;
  - d) The ticket shall not be transferable to another vehicle;
  - e) The ticket shall be exhibited on the vehicle:-
    - (i) in the case of a two wheeled motor cycle having a sidecar attached thereto, or any other vehicle not having a windscreen, in a conspicuous position on the near side of the vehicle in front of the driving seat; or
    - (ii) in the case of any other vehicle, in a conspicuous position facing forward on the inside of the glass of the windscreen, on the near side of the vehicle;
  - f) The trexet shall be so exhibited on the vehicle that the time and other details indicated on the front thereof are clearly visible to a person standing on the near side of the vehicle.

#### Exemption from charges

- 27 a) If when a vehicle is left during the restricted hours in a parking place there is a notice placed by a person duly authorised by the Council on the ticket parking meter indicating that the meter is out of order, and there is no alternative ticket parking meter not out of order within 100 metres of the parking bay in which the vehicle is left then that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge provided that the vehicle is removed before the expiry of the maximum time specified in Schedule 13(A);
  - b) If a vehicle is left during the restricted hours in a parking place by the driver thereof, which is driven by, or carrying, a disabled person, and which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge issued by a local authority in exercise of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970 shall be exempt from the charges specified in this Order;
  - which either paragraphs (a) or (b) applies shall stand in the parking place in accordance with Particle 35 of this Order.

#### Indications by parking meter tickets

- Payment of the initial charge for a vehicle left in a parking place shall be indicated by the issue from a ticket parking meter at or near the parking place of a numbered ticket indicating what charge has been paid and the date and time of departure due and by the exhibition of the ticket in accordance with Article 26 of this Order;
  - b) The expiry of the period for which the initial charge has been paid shall be indicated when there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket issued by a ticket parking meter relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left indicating the expiry time in respect of the period for which payment has been made and where the time shown on the clock on the ticket parking meter is later than the time shown on the ticket.

## Indications by parking ticket meters and tickets as evidence

- 29 a) If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 26 of this Order it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the initial charge has not been duly paid;
  - If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place the clock on the ticket parking meter relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left and the parking ticket exhibited on the vehicle and issued from the ticket parking meter gives one of the indications mentioned in paragraph (b) of Article 28 of this Order it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the charge has been duly paid and that the period for which payment was made by the charge has already expired.

#### Amount of excass charge at parking places

- a) If a vesticle is left in a parking place described in Schedule 12 to this Order, during the restricted hours, for longer than the initial period for which payment was made by the initial charge, the initial charge together with an additional amount as detailed in Schedule 13(B) to this Order (which additional amount is hereinafter referred to as the "excess charge") shall be payable; and
  - b) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge has been incurred it shall be the duty of a traffic warden or parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:-
    - (i) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle; and
    - (ii) the time at which he or she first noticed that the ticket parking meter indicated, in the manner specified in Article 28 of this Order, that the initial period for which payment was made by the initial charge had expired; and
    - (iii) a statement that an excess charge of the amount detailed in Schedule 13(B) is required to be paid;
    - (iv) the manner in which, and the time within which, the excess charge should be paid; and

(v) a statement that it is an offence under section 47 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place described in Schedule 12 to this Order to fail duly to pay the excess charge.

## Period for which a vehicle may be left after excess charge incurred

The period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place during the restricted hours after the excess charge has been incurred shall not exceed the time specified in Schedule 13(B) to this Order.

#### Restriction on the removal of notices

Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 30(b) of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

## Method of payment of excess charges

The excess payment shall be paid to the Council either by cheque, bankers draft, credit transfer, money order or postal order which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the Collector's Office at 45 John Street, Glasgow, G1 IJE, not later than 4.00pm on the seventh day following the day on which the excess charge was incurred, or 3.30pm if the seventh day falls on a Friday, or in cash in person at the said office, not later than as aforesaid. Provided that, if the said seventh day falls on a Saturday or upon a day on which the said office is closed, the period within which payment of the said charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until the first day thereafter on which the said office is open.

#### Interval before vehicle may again be left

No vehicle w'he is has been taken away from a parking place, after the initial charge has been incurred, shall intil the expiration of one hour from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the restricted hours.

#### Manner of standing in parking places

- Every vehicle which has been left in a parking place in respect of which a charge has been incurred, shall so stand:-
  - (i) that the left or nearside of the vehicle is adjacent to the left hand edge of the carriageway; and
  - (ii) that the distance between the left hand edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 mm.

#### Alteration of position of vehicle in parking places

Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Articles 27(c) or 35 of this Order, a traffic warden or parking attendant may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

#### Removal of vehicle from parking places

Where a traffic warden or parking attendant is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Articles 24, 26, 28(a), 31, 34 or 35 of this Order have been contravened of have not been complied with in respect of a vehicle left in a parking place, he or she may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

#### Movement of repicles in parking places in an emergency

Any person dairy authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden or parking attendant may move or cause to be moved in an emergency, to any place he or she thinks fit, vehicles left in a parking place.

#### Power to suspend parking places

- Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he or she considers such suspension as reasonably necessary:-
  - (i) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
  - (ii) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water, electricity or of any telegraphic line, traffic sign or parking meter: or
  - (iii) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to depository or to such premises from a depository; or
  - (iv) on any occasion when it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
  - (v) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on the occasion of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions;
  - A police constable may suspend for not more than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he or she considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - c) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with this Article shall thereupon:-
    - (i) place or cause to be placed over any ticket parking meter relating to the parking place, or that part thereof, notices, indicating that the use of the bays is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited; and/or

- place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to any part of that parking place, the use of which is suspended, a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited;
- On any suspension of the use of a parking place, or any part thereof, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Article any person duly authorised by the Council may temporarily remove any ticket parking meter relating to that parking place or, as the case may be, that part thereof and any post, bracket or other support on which such ticket parking meter is fitted and shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place a traffic sign giving the indication referred to in paragraph (c) (ii) of this Article;
- e) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a parking bay during such period as there is over the ticket parking meter relating to that bay a hood or other cover, or is affixed to the ticket parking meter a notice, indicating that the use of the bay is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent to that bay a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (c) (ii) of this Article;

Provided that nothing in this Article shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, or any vehicle being used for any purpose specified in Article 41(a) (ii), (iv), (vi), or (vii) of this Order to be left in the parking place if that vehicle is left with the permission (i) of the person suspending the use of the parking place or the part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (a) of this Article, (ii) of a police constable in uniform or (iii) of a traffic warden.

#### Restriction on use of vehicles at parking places

- a) No present shall use any vehicle, while it is in a parking place during the restricted hours, in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or of their services in any other capacity;
  - b) Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is one which may be left in a parking place in accordance with Article 24 of this Order and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

#### Restriction of waiting of vehicles in parking places

- 41 a) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to vehicles which are left in a parking place in accordance with those provisions, any other vehicle may wait during the restricted hours anywhere in a parking place if:-
  - (i) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; or
  - (ii) a vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident; or

- (iii) the vehicle is used for fire brigade purposes or is an ambulance or a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a local authority or police force, in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
- (iv) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- (v) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 39(a) (ii) of this Order; or
- the vehicle is a vehicle in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or post boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting; or
- (vii) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- b) No charge specified in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article;
- c) Except as provided in the foregoing provisions of this Article, the driver of a vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to wait in a parking place during the restricted hours;
- d) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act, 1984.

## Manner of waiting in parking places

A person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a parking place by virtue of Article 41(a) (v), (vi) or (vii) shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 mm.

## Installation of ticket parking meters

There shall be a ticket parking meter at or near each parking place described in Schedule 12 to this Order.

## Power to dispose of abandoned vehicles

- The Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed from a parking place in pursuance of Article 37 of this Order, if it appears to them to have been abandoned, sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the nage and address of the owner of the vehicle;
  - The Council shall be deemed not to have made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of any vehicle to which this Article applies unless they have taken, in relation to that vehicle, such steps that may be prescribed by any Regulations for the time being in force under Section 99 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, for authorising the Council to sell off or otherwise dispose of the vehicle if it had been left on a road and if it appeared to the Council that it had been abandoned.


