GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL

CITY CENTRE WEST STREAMLINE (KELVINGROVE to CHARING CROSS) (TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2009

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Glasgow City Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 1(1), 2(1) to (3), Part IV of Schedule 9 and Sections 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order.

PART I GENERAL

Citation and Commencement

- (a) This Order may be cited as "Glasgow City Council (Streamline Works) (City Centre West) (Traffic Regulation) Order 2009" and shall come into operation on Sunday, 21 November 2009.
 - (b) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
 - (c) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the Interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament'
- 2. The Council is eatisfied that for facilitating the passage of vehicular traffic on the roads to which the order relates it is requisite that Section 3 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 should not apply to the Order.

Interpretation

In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"vehicle" means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along reads whether or not by mechanical power;

"goods vahicle" means a vehicle constructed or adapted for the use of the conveyance of goods or burdens of any description but not including a dual-purpose vehicle;

"dual-purpose vahicle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1988 as originally enacted;

"taxt" has the same meaning as in Section 23(1) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;

"private hire car" has the same meaning as in Section 23 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;

"licensed private hire car" means a private hire car licensed under Section 10 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, clearly marked as such and driven by a person holding a valid private hire car driver's licence or taxi driver's licence issued in accordance with Section 13 of the aforementioned Act;

"universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

"disabled person's badge" and "relevant position" have the meanings given in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 as originally enacted;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2000;

"emergency service vehicle" means any vehicle for the time being in use by the Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Services or Civil Defence Organisation;

"pedal cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"local authority" means Glasgow City Council;

"council" means Glasgow City Council;

"refuse vehicle" means a vehicle being used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties by the City Council's Environmental Protection Services in connection with the uplift and removal of domestic refuse;

"buses" means (a) before 1st January 1997 (i) public service vehicles used for the provision of local services or scheduled express services; (ii) school buses; or (iii) works buses; and (b) after 31st December 1998 (i) motor vehicles constructed or adapted to carry more than 8 passengers (exclusive of driver); and (ii) local buses not so constructed or adapted;

"public service vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

"local service" has the same meaning as in the Transport Act 1985;

"local bus" means any bus in use for the time being for the provision of a local service;

"24 hour bus, text and cycle lane" means the area of the carriageway of a road specified in Schedule 7 to this Order lying between the edge of the carriageway and the longitudinal white line placed on the carriageway in accordance with Diagram 1049 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"traffic lane", "contra-flow lane" and "with-flow lane" have the meanings given in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994 as originally enacted;

"Two-way Cycle Path" means a width of carriageway, for use of cyclists traveling in either direction, separated from the rest of the carriageway by a 600mm wide white line or raised median.

Certain Roads To Have With-Flow Bus, Taxt and Cycle Lanss

- 4. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to wait in or enter or proceed along any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to :-
 - (i) a bus;
 - (ii) a taxi;
 - (iii) a pedal cycle;
 - (iv) a licensed private hire car;
 - (v) a vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes:

- 6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle being used in connection with :-
 - (i) any building operation or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of roads so referred to;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of reads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (v) the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
 - (vi) any statutory powers and duties of a local authority;

provided that in all circumstances it is necessary for the vehicle to enter the bus lane.

- 7. Nothing in Article 4 shall apply to a person who drives or causes or permits a vehicle to enter a bus lane if the vehicle enters the bus lane :-
 - (i) from an adjacent part of the road through any gap in the single white line and forthwith enters a road which lies opposite the gap;
 - (ii) from any vehicular access way or crossing over the footway adjoining the bus lane and forthwith leaves the bus lane at a point opposite that vehicular access way or crossing:
 - (iii) from an adjacent part of the road at a point opposite any vehicular access way or crossing over the footway adjoining the bus lane and forthwith enters that vehicular access way or crossing;
 - (iv) for the gaining of access to or egress from off-street loading or garaging premises adjacent to or accessible only across the bus lane;
 - (v) for the gaining of access to or egrees from on-street loading or parking adjacent to or accessible only across the bus lane.

Certain Roads To Have Contra-Flow Cycle Lanes

- 8. Save as provided in Articles 9 and 10 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to wait in or enter or proceed along any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.
- 9. Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall apply to a pedal cycle.
- 10. Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle being used in connection with :-
 - (i) any building operation or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic:
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of roads so referred to:
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984:
 - (v) the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
 - (vi) any statutory powers and duties of a local authority;

provided that in all circumstances it is necessary for the vehicle to enter the cycle lane.

Certain Roads to Have Two-way Cycle Paths

- 11. No person shall, except upon the direction or with permission of a Police Constable in uniform, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to wait in or enter or proceed along any length of two-way cycle path specified in Schedule 4 to this Order.
- 12. Nothing in Article 7 shall apply to a vehicle being used in connection with:-

(i) any building operation or demolition;

(ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any road;

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984(a) in or near any road;
- (v) the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;

(vi) any statutory powers or duties of a local authority;

provided that in all of the circumstances it is necessary for the vehicle to enter the Two-way Cycle Path.

Contra-Flow Cycle Lanes

13. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle, with the exception of pedal cycles on the contra-flow cycle lane, on lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Order other than in the directions specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

One Way Operation

14. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Order other than in the directions specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

Prohibition of Right Hand Turn

15. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 5 to this Order so as to make a right-hand turn into the road specified opposite to such road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

Prohibition of Left Hand Turn

16. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 5 to this Order so as to make a right-hand turn into the road specified opposite to such road in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

Amendments

17. The Orders specified in Schedule 7 to this Order shall have effect subject to the amendments specified in that Schedule.
