THE STRATHCLYDE REGIONAL COUNCIL (VARIOUS STREETS, HIANTYRE)
(WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS AND PROHIBITION OF ENTRY) OFDER 1979

The Etratholyde Regional Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 1 (1), (2), (3) and (30) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as smended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 14 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 and Schedule 5 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with section 840 (1) of the Act of 1967, hereby make the following order:-

- 1. This order may be cited as "The Strathclyde Regional Council (Various Streets, Blantyre) (Waiting and Loading Restrictions and Prohibition of Entry) Order 1975" and shall come into operation on the Thirtieth Cay of April, Nineteen hundred and seventy-nine.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. In this order the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:"Chief Constable" means the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police;
 "Council" means the Strathclyde Regional Council; and
 "the restricted road" means my road specified in Schedule I to this

- 4. Save as provided in articles 6 and 7 of this order no person shall, 72 ept upon the direction or with the permission of a police comptable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, inclusive, in any of the lengths of the roads specified in Schedule I to this order.
- 5. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle proceeding in any of the roads specified in column 1 of Schedule II to this order so as to enter the road specified in relation thereto on the same line of column 2 of the said Schedule.
- 6. Nothing in Article 4 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of the roads referred to in that Article:-
 - (a) for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage;
 - (b) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or denolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of the road so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair to or near to the said length of the road, of any sever or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;

- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (d) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (e) if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Fost Office and is waiting in the restricted road while postal packets addressed to previses adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to that road;
- (2) for the purpose of leading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is standing at the kerb and is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository:
- (g) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with funeral operations; or
- (n) if the vehicle is not causing an obstruction and is a vehicle driven by a severely disabled person or a person carrying a severely disabled passenger and has been left in the restricted mid by a reason to whom an appropriate authority have imputed a disabled driver's badge or a disabled passenger's badge and that tadge is disabled.

- 7. (a) Nothing in Article 4 of this order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the restricted road for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjoining that road provided that no vehicle engaged in delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or being loaded or unloaded shall wait for a longer period than thirty minutes in the same place (except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday; and
 - (b) notwithstanding anything in paragraph (a) of this Article, the driver of a vehicle waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle shall move the same on the instruction of a police constable uniform whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing obstruction.
